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STEM UPDATE

Dear Parents,

September has been an exciting month as our students continued their STEM journey with curiosity and creativity. A special highlight was Open Challenge Week, where all grades took part in projects and engineering challenges designed to spark innovation and problem-solving.

From Year 1 to Year 5, students explored a wide range of STEM topics, from planetary surfaces, moon cycles, and basic engineering design, to light and reflection, the Scientific Method, bridge construction, and even yeast fermentation experiments.

Older students (Year 6–IGCSE2) focused on their long-term CREST STEM Fair projects. They applied the scientific method, worked collaboratively on research and design, and practiced presenting their findings in the context of sustainability. Some projects include building whale models, creating lanterns from plastic waste, designing tote bags from nylon, Scratch games, environmental awareness videos, and more...
