MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear SIS Parents, Caregivers, Family and Friends

ROBOTICS CLUB

The robotics club, run by Ms. Amy and Mr. Jonathan, was a great exercise at exploring the endless opportunities of the UB Tech Stem Kit. The club decided to build a boom gate and was challenged with creating a code which had to open and close the boom based on whether an object was in front of the gate. The students finally got to finish the build before the end of the term – see photos below.
