MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I would like to welcome new families and thank all existing families for choosing SIS @ BDNC for your child's education. We are an English-Vietnamese International school and by choosing our school we will equip your children with the knowledge and skills that they will require to succeed at both local universities and English speaking universities across the world.

This year our school will be focusing on the teaching of Reading. We have developed a comprehensive school wide reading program that will assist students with phonemic awareness (sounds), phonics (letter sound relationships), vocabulary (knowing the meaning of words), fluency (being able to decode words and read smoothly) and comprehension (understanding what they are reading). We ask you to support this by ensuring your children read every day.

We have some new facilities in the school with the construction of our new basketball court almost complete. This will be a great resource for students and will be welcomed into our Physical Education programs. The primary court yard has also experienced and upgrade. Moving forward, discussions are being held for new facilities and the potential for new buildings. Continued growth will hopefully make this a viable option in the very near future.

I would like to welcome all new staff members. OUT OF SCHOOL TUTORING

ACADEMIC CHAMPIONS CRITERIA

Last year KinderWorld changed the criteria for selecting the academic champion for Integrated classes. In the past, this award was given to the student in the class with the highest English grade for the year. The criteria now includes Vietnamese grades as well as their English grades. This gives a fairer reflection of an Integrated student's overall performance.

For International students, the criteria remains the student's combined score for English, mathematics and science.
